LPN Advanced Placement Bachelor of Science in Nursing





The LPN Advanced Placement program is designed to help you complete your BSN degree while helping you balance your life with your educational and career goals. Upon graduating from the program *and* successfully passing the NCLEX-RN, you will be qualified to begin working as a Registered Nurse.

- Part-time (10 terms) or full-time (6 terms) plans of study
- Fall or Spring admission
- Eligible transfer credits accepted
- Earn up to 18 credit hours through advanced placement testing
- NO entrance exam
- Admission Criteria
 - GPA \geq 2.75 on courses that count toward the BSN degree (including repeated courses)
 - An unencumbered PN license
 - No more than one science failure (pertains to BIO 234, BIO 235, BIO 260, CHE 101, AND HEA 240)
 - Applicants with more than one science failure must meet the minimum required TEAS score (see Pre-licensure BSN admission information) *and* score at or above the BSN program mean on the TEAS science sub-score in order to demonstrate science proficiency and be considered for admission to the nursing program.
 - Must complete all prerequisite courses and ten or more hours of university core requirements prior to entering the nursing program


