- Be in good standing at William Carey University
- Have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 on all courses taken toward meeting the nursing degree requirement

*Five hours of electives are required. The five hours can come from a general or nursing elective. NUR 330 may be used to satisfy two o the five required elective hours.
