I Then shall the Priest, turning to the People, rebearfe distinctly all the TEN COMMAND-MENTS: and the People Still kneeling, shall after swery Com. mandment, aft Gad mercy for their transgression thereof for the time past, and grace to keep the same for the time to come, as followeth.

For in fix days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and refled the leventh day: wherefore the Lord bleffed the feventh day, and hallowed it.

A Lmighty God, whose king-A dom is everlasting, and power infinite; Have mercy upon the whole Church, and so rule the heart of thy chosen fervant GEORGE, our King and Governor, that he (knowing whose minister he is) may above all things feek thy honour and glory; and that we and all his subjects (duly confidering whole authority he

nour, and humbly obey him, in thee, and for thee, according to thy bleffed Word and Ordinance, through Jefus Christ our Lord, who with thee and the Holy Ghoft, liveth and reigneth ever one God, world without end. Amen.

Lonighty and everlatting In God, we are taught by thy holy Word, that the hearts of Kings are in thy rule and governance, and that thou doft dispose and turn them as it seemeth best to thy godly wisdom; We humbly befeech thee so to dispose and govern the heart of GEORGE thy fervant, our King and Governor, that in all his thoughts, words and works, he may ever feek thy honour and glory, and Audy to preferve thy people committed to his charge, in wealth, peace and godliness: Grant this, O merciful Father, for thy dear Son's fake Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Then shall be faid the Collect of the Day. And immediately after the Collect, the Priest shall read the Epistle, saying, The Epistle, for, The portion of Scripture appointed for the Epiftle is written in the - Chapter of - beginning at the - Verse. And the Epifile ended, be shall say, Here endeth the Epifile. Then shall he read the Gospel (the People all standing up) saying, The Holy Gospel is written in the - Chapter of -begin-
