that ye be not judged of the Lord; repent ye truly for

your fins past; have a lively and stedfast faith in Christ our Saviour; amend your lives, and be in perfect charity with all men; so shall ye be meet partakers of those holy mysteries. And above all things ye must give most humble and hearty thanks to God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, for the redemption of the world by the death and paffion of our Saviour Christ, both God and man; who did humble himself even to the death upon the Crofs, for us miferable finmers, who lay in darkness and the shadow of death; that he might make us the children of God, and exalt us to everlasting life. And to the end that we should alway remember the exceeding great love of our Mafter and only Saviour Jefus Christ, thus dying for us, and the innumerable benefits which by his precious bloodfhedding he hath obtained to us; he hath instituted and ordained holy mysteries, as pledges of his love, and for a continual remembrance of his death, to our great and endless comfort. To him therefore, with the Father and the Holy Ghost, let us give (as we are most bounder) continual thanks; fubmitting ourfelves wholly to his holy will and pleafure, and studying to ferve him in true holiness and righteousness all the days of our life. Amen.

Then shall the Priest Say to them that come to receive the boly Communion;

▼ TE that do truly and ear neftly repent you of your fins, and are in love and charity with your neighbours, si and intend to lead a new life, following the Commandments of God, and walking from henceforth in his holy ways: Draw near with faith, and take this holy Sacrament to your comfort; and make your humble confession to Almightv God, meekly kneeling upon your knees.

¶ Then shall this general Confesfion be made in the name of all those that are minded to receive the boly Communion. by one of the Ministers, both he and all the People kneeling humbly upon their knees, and Saying,

Lmighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Maker of all things, Judge of all men; We acknowledge and bewail our manifold fins and wickedness, Which we from time to time most grievously have committed by thought, word, and deed, against thy Divine Majesty, Provoking most justly thy wrath and indignation against us. We do earneftly repent, and are heartily forry for these our misdoings; The remembrance of them is grievous unto us; The burden of them is intolerable. Have mercy upon us, Have mercy upon us, most merciful

Father; For thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, forgive us all that is past; And grant that we may ever hereafter ferve and please thee in newness of life, To the honour and glory of thy Name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

I Then shall the Priest (or the Bishop being present) stand up, and turning himself to the Peo- to the Lord. tle, pronounce this Absolution.

A Lmighty God our heavenly Father, who of his great merey bath promised forgiveness of fins to all them, that with hearty repentance and true faith turn unto him; Have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your fins, confirm and Arengthen you in all goodnels, and bring you to everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord Amen.

A Then shall the Priest Say, Hear what comfortable words our Saviour Christ faith unto all that truly turn to him. OME unto me, all ye that travel, and are heavy laden, and I will refresh you. S.Mattb. 11. 28.

So God loved the world. that he gave his only-begotten Son, to the end that all that believe in him, should not perish, but have everlasting life. S. 70bn_2. 16. Hear also what S. Paul saith.

Hear also what S. John saith. If any man fin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jefus Christ the righteous; and he is the propitiation for our fins. 1 S. John 2. 1. 2.

After which the Priest shall proceed, Saying,

Shall follow, Herefore with Angels and Archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify thy glorious Name; evermore praising thee, and faying, Holy, holy, holy Lord God of hosts, heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Glory be to thee, O Lord most high. Amen.
