The MINISTRATION of Private BAPTISM of Children in Houses.

THE Curates of every Parish shall often admonish the People that they defer not the Baptism of their Children longer than the first or second Sunday next after their Birth, or other Holyday falling between, unless upon a great and reasonable cause, to

be approved of by the Curate. ¶ And also they shall warn them, that without like great cause and necessity they procure not their Children to be baptized at home in their houses. But when need shall compel them so to do, then Baptism shall be administered on this fashion.
