thy fa herly hand, we befeech thee, ever be over them; let thy holy Spirit ever be with them; and fo lead them in the knowledge and obedience of thy Word, that in the end they may obtain everlasting life, through our Lord Jesus Christ, who with thee and the Holy Ghost liveth and reigneth, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

Almighty Lord, and everlasting God, vouchfafe, we beseech thee, to direct, sanctify, and govern both our hearts and bodies in the ways of thy laws, and in the works of thy commandments; that through thy most mighty protection, both here and ever, we may be preserved in body and soul. through our Lord and Saviour Iefus Christ. Amen.

I Then the Bishop shall bless them Saying thus,

HE Bleffing of God Al-I mighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghoft, be upon you, and remain with you for ever. Amen.

And there shall none be admitted to the boly Communion, until such time as he be confirmed, or be ready and desirous to be confirmed.

The Form of Solemnization of MATRIMONY.

I First the Banns of all that are to be married together, must be published in the Church three several Sundays or Holy-days, in the time of divine Service, immediately before the Sentences for the Offertory; the Curate saying after the accustomed manner:

riage between M. of and \overline{N} . of —— If any of you know cause or just impediment why these two persons should not be joined together in holy Matrimony, ye are to declare it : This is the first, [fecond or third] time of asking.

And if the Persons that are to be married, dwell in divers Parishes, the Banns, must be asked in both Parishes; and the Curate of the one Parish shall . not folemnize Matrimony betwixt them, without a Certificate of the Banns being thrice asked from the Curate of the other Parish.

Publish the Bands of Mar- ¶ At the day and time appointed for solemnization of Matrimony, the Persons to be married shall come into the body of the Church with their Friends and Neighbours: And there standing together, the Man on the right hand, and the Woman on the left, the Priest shall say.

Early beloved, we are gathered together here in the fight of God, and in the face of this congregation, to join together this man and this woman in holy Matrimony; which is an honourable estate, instituted of God in the time of man's innocency, fignifying unto us the mystical union that

that is betwixt Christ and his Church; which holy estate Christ adorned and beautified with his presence, and first miracle that he wrought in Cana of Galilee, and is commended of Saint Paul to be honourable among all men; and therefore is not by any to be enterprised, nor taken in hand unadvisedly, lightly, or wantonly, to fatisfy men's carnal lusts and appetites, like brute beafts that have no understanding; but reverently, discreetly, advisedly,

Toberly, and in the fear of God, duly confidering the causes for whichMatrimonywasordained. First, it was ordained for the procreation of children, to be

brought up in the fear and nurture of the Lord, and to the praise of his holy Name.

Secondly, it was ordained for a remedy against fin, and to avoid fornication, that such persons as have not the gift of continency, might marry, and keepthemselves undefiledmem-

bers of Christ's body. Thirdly, it was ordained for the mutual fociety, help, and comfort that the one ought to have of the other, both in profperity and adversity:

Into which holy estate these two persons present come now to be joined. Therefore if any man can shew any just cause why they may not lawfully be joined together, let him now speak, or else hereaster for ever hold his peace.

¶ And also speaking unto the per-Sons that shall be married, be shall fay,

Require and charge you both (as ye will answer at the dreadful day of judgement, when the fecrets of all hearts fhall be disclosed) that if either of you know any impediment. why ye may not be lawfully. joined together in Matrimony, ye do now confess it. For be, ye well affured, that fo many as are coupled together otherwife than God's word doth allow, are not joined together. by God, neither is their Matrimony lawful.

¶ At which day of Marriage, if any man do alledge and declare any impediment why they may not be coupled to-, gether in Matrimony, by God's Law, or the Laws of this Realm; and will be bound. and sufficient sureties with him, to the parties, or else out in a caution (to the full value of such charges as the persons

to be married do thereby suf-

tain) to prove his allegation:

then the folemnization must

be deferred until such time as the truth be tried. ¶ If no impediment be alledged, then shall the Curate say unto the man :

M. TTTILT thou have this W woman to thy wedded wife, to live together after God's ordinance, in the holy estate of Matrimony? Wilt thou love her, comfort her, honour and keep her in fickness and in health, and forfaking all other, keep thee only unto her, fo long as ye both shall live?
