The Epiftle. Rom. 13. 8.

WE no man any thing, but to love one another: for he that loveth another hath fulfilled the law. For this, Thou shalt not commit adultery, Thou shalt not kill, Thou shalt not steal, Thou shalt not bear false witness, Thou shalt not

covet; and if there be any other commandment it is briefly comprehended in this faying, namely, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. Love worketh no ill to his neighbour: therefore love is the fulfilling of the law. And that, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of fleep: for now is our falvation nearer than when we believed. The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore caft off the works of darknels, and let us put on the armour of light; let us walk honeftly as in the day, not in rioting and drunkenness, not in chambering and wantonness, not in strife and envying. But put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not provision for the flesh, to fulfil the lufts thereof.

The Gospel. S. Matth. 21. 1.

TX7HEN they drew nigh ! V unto Jerusalem, and were come to Bethphage, unto the mount of Olives, then fent Jesus two disciples, saying unto them, Go into the village over against you, and straightway ye shall find an ass tied

if any man fay ought unto you, ye shall fay. The Lord hath need of them; and firaightway he will fend them. All this was done that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, faying, Tell ye the daughter of Sion, Behold, thy King cometh unto thee meek, and fitting upon an ass, and a colt the fole of an ass. TT/Hatsoever things were VV written aforetime were written for our learning; that we through patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope. Now the God of patience and confolation grant you to be like-minded one towards another, according to Christ Jesus: That ye may with one mind, and one mouth glorify God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Wherefore receive ye one another as Christ also received us to the glory of God. Now I fay that Jesus Christ was a minister of the circumcision for the truth of God, to confirm the promises made unto the fathers: And that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy; as it is written, For this cause I will confess to thee among the Gentiles, and fing unto thy Name.
