THEN if any man shall say unto you, Lo, here is Christ, or there; believe it not. For there shall arise salse Christs, and salse prophets, and shall shew great signs and won-

ders; infomuch that, if it were possible, they shall deceive the very elect. Behold, I have told vou before. Wherefore, if they shall say unto you, Behold, he is in the defert; go not forth: behold, he is in the fecret chambers: believe it not. For as the lightning cometh out of the east, and shineth even unto the west: so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. For wherefoever the carcafe is. there will the eagles be gathered together.
