## PSALM. CVI.

42 That they his holy statutes might observe for evermore.

And faithfully obey his laws: Praise ye the Lord therefore.

PSAL. 106. N.

DRAISE ye the Lord, for he is good, his mercy lasts alway: Who can express his noble acts. or all his praise display? 2 They bleffed are that judgement keep, and juffly do alway; remember me, I pray;

With favour of thy people, Lord, vouchfafe to vifit me: That I the great felicity of thine elect may see:

3 And with thy faving health, O Lord, a joyful mind poffefs, And may with thine inheritance a cheerful heart express.

4 And with thy people's joy I may 5 Both we and our forefathers all have finned every one;

We have committed wickedness, and very lewdly done.

6 The wonders great which thou, O Lord, hast done in Egypt land, Our fathers though they faw them all, yet did not understand: 7 Nor yet thy mercies manifold did keep in memory: But at the lea, yea, the Red-sea, rebell'd ungratefully.

8 Nevertheless, he saved them for honour of his Name; That he might make his power known, and spread abroad his fame. 9 The Red-fea he did then rebuke. As in the wilderness, so through of their most spiteful soe,

and forthwith it was dry'd; the deep he did them guide. 10 He fav'd them from the cruel hand And from their enemies he did deliver them also. The Second Part.

II The waters did them overthrow. not one was left alive: Then they believ'd his word, and praise in song they did him give. 12 But very foon ungratefully his works they quite forgat. And for his counfel and his will they did neglect to wait : 23 But finned in the wilderness with fond and greedy luft,

And in the defert tempted God, their only stay and trust : 34 Who all their wanton minds defire did fuffer them to have; But wasting leanness therewithal into their fouls he gave. 15 Then when they lodged in their tents, at Moses they did grutch; Agron the holy of the Lord they also envy'd much. 16 Therefore the earth did open wide, and Dathan did devour ;

And all Abiram's company did cover in that hour. 17 In their affembly kindled was a hot confuming fire. And wasting flame did then burn up the wicked in his ire 18 Upon the hill of Horeb they an idol calf did frame: And there the molten image they did worship of the same. 19 Thus to the likeness of a calf. which feedeth on the grass.

They turned all their glory, and their honour did deface: 20 And God their only Saviour they unthankfully forgot, Who many great and mighty things in Egypt's land had wrought: The Third Part. 21 And in the land of Ham for them most wond'rous works had done. And by the Red-fea dreadful things performed long agone.

22 Therefore because they shew'd themselves forgetful and unkind. To bring destruction on them all he purpos'd in his mind. 23 Had not his chosen Moses stood before him in the way. To turn away his wrath, left he should them destroy and slav. 24 They did despise the pleasant land that he to them did give, Yea, and the words that he had fooke they did no whit believe:

25 But in their tents with grudging heart they wickedly repin'd, Nor to the voice of God the Lord did give an heark ning mind. 26 Therefore against them lifted he his strong revenging hand. Them to deftroy in wilderness. before they faw the land: 27 And to destroy their seed among the nations with his rod. And through the kingdoms of the world to scatter them abroad. 28 To Baal-peor they did join themselves most wickedly.

29 Thus they with their inventions did his anger much provoke; And in his fore enkindled wrath

The Fourth Part. 31 It was imputed unto him And from thenceforth to counted is 32 At waters called Meribah

30 But Phineas stood up with zeal

And judgement he did execute,

Yea, fo far forth that Moses then 33 Because they vex'd his spirit so. His lips spake unadvisedly, 34 Nor as the Lord commanded them.

But were among the heathen mix'd, 35 They did their idols serve, which was To devils fons and daughters did

Ev'n their own fonsand daughters blood without all cause of guilt: 37 Whom they to Canaan's idols then And so with blood of innocents

And with their own inventions did 39 Therefore against his people was

And ev'n his own inheritance 40 Into the hands of heathen men And made their foes their lords, whom they were forced to obey.

41 Yea, and their hateful enemies And they were humbly made to floop 42 Full oftentimes from thrall had he

But they rebell'd against him, and 43 Therefore they by their wickedness Yet when he faw them in diffress 44 He call'd to mind his covenant,

And by his mercies multitude 45 And favour he them made to find That led them captive from their land, 46 Save us, O Lord, thou art our God,

And from among the heathen folk, 47 That we may triumph and rejoice That we may glory in thy praile,

I And that his mercy hath no end

48 The Lord the God of Ifrael Let all the people fay, Amen. PSAL. 107. TIVE thanks unto the Lord our God.

2 Such as the Lord redeemed hath 3 He gather'd them forth of the lands From east to west, from north to south 4 They wander'd in the wilderness,

their ruin and decay; they offer up and flay; 36 Yea, with unkind and murd'ring knife, the guiltless blood they spilt, offer'd with wicked hand: defiled was the land. 38 Thus they were stained with the works of their own filthy way; a whoring go aftray.

his anger kindled fore, he did abhor therefore. he gave them for a prey; The Fifth Part. oppress'd them in their land. as fubject to their hand.

deliver'd them before; provok'd him evermore. were brought full low to he: he hearken'd to their cry; which he to them had fwore, repented him therefore: before the fight of those,

though they had been their foes. we do thee humbly pray, Lord, gather us away; in thy most holy Name, and founding of thy fame. be bleffed evermore: Praise ye the Lord therefore.
