Program Overview

The Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree in Health Administration & Education combines administration and education courses in a 120-hour online healthcare curriculum to allow degree completion and career advancement for the student with an associate degree in a health-related career. The degree provides the graduate with a sound foundation to enter the health industry or the academic environment. The curriculum places emphasis on the foundational skills needed in the development of managers, educators, and administrators in a variety of healthcare settings. Graduates will be prepared to educate entry-level practitioners as well as function as leaders and managers in a variety of health-related areas including businesses, government and volunteer agencies, outpatient clinics, hospitals, and industry. The B.S. degree in Health Administration & Education will provide the graduate with the ability to advance to higher degrees in education, business, and administration.

Admission Requirements

- 1. Submission of a completed application to William Carey University.
- 2. Must be in good standing at William Carey University and have a cumulative grade point average ≥ 2.5.
- Hold an associate's degree in a health-related field, or be registered/licensed/certified in a healthrelated field.
- 4. Submit the completed and notarized criminal background check affidavit.
- 5. Evidence of a negative drug screen prior to participating in a practicum course.

27 Hours Elective Credit

• Up to 27 hours of elective credit will be given per discipline based on a review of curriculum that provided licensure, certification, or registry.

Progression

Students in the Health Administration & Education program are required to maintain a GPA ≥ 2.5 on Health Administration & Education major courses.

- Any courses with a grade of D or F must be repeated.
- Major core courses may be repeated twice to achieve a minimum grade of C.
- No more than three individual courses may be repeated.
