# **Admission Requirements**

Admission to the DPT program is competitive in nature, and students with strong academic background are encouraged to apply. Students will be admitted to the program in the Fall semester of each year, based on the following requirements:

- Completion of a Baccalaureate Degree (applicant's choice) from an accredited college or university <u>OR</u> be in the final year of undergraduate study
- Completion of Prerequisite Courses
- Minimum overall 3.0 GPA OR on the last 60 hours of graduate/undergraduate coursework
- Complete 40 total hours of observation under a physical therapist in two distinctly different settings. One of the settings
  must be an inpatient setting (acute care, inpatient rehabilitation, nursing home, and/or skilled nursing). Must be verified
  and submitted electronically to PTCAS.
- Official GRE scores (within last 10 years) including verbal, quantitative, and analytical
  - o Minimum score of 290 required for combined verbal/quantitative. Submit to PTCAS using Institutional Code 7400.

The Admissions Committee is seeking well-rounded applicants with good time management skills. Complete all sections of the PTCAS application.

**Interviews** - The William Carey University DPT program does not require an interview as part of the admissions process. Prospective students are encouraged to schedule campus visits and attend DPT2B informational sessions to learn more about the program. Applications and all supporting documents must be submitted through the Physical Therapy Centralized Application Services (PTCAS) at <a href="www.ptcas.org">www.ptcas.org</a> by October 15, 2025 for early consideration or by the final application deadline of March 16, 2026. Use Institutional Code 7400. No documents should be sent directly to William Carey University.
