### The Program

The LPN Advanced Placement program is designed to help you complete your BSN degree while helping you balance your life with your educational and career goals. Upon graduating from the program *and* successfully passing the NCLEX-RN, you will be qualified to begin working as a Registered Nurse.

- Part-time (7 terms) or full-time (4 terms) plans of study
- Fall or Spring admission
- Eligible transfer credits accepted
- Earn up to 18 credit hours through advanced placement testing
- **NO ENTRANCE EXAM**
- **FREE TEXTBOOKS**

### Admission Criteria

- GPA  $\geq 2.75$  on courses that count toward the BSN degree (including repeated courses)
- An unencumbered PN license
- No more than one science course failure (pertains to BIO 234, BIO 235, BIO 260, CHE 104, AND HEA 240)
- Applicants with more than one science course failure (in the same or a combination of courses) must take the ATI TEAS pre-admission exam to demonstrate science proficiency for admission eligibility.
  - Applicants are not required to meet a minimum composite score but must achieve a science sub-score at or above the BSN program mean for the science section.
- Must complete all prerequisite courses and 16 or more hours of university core requirements prior to entering the nursing program. All university core must be completed prior to completion of BSN degree.
- General admission to William Carey University does not mean that a student has been admitted to the nursing program. Students must contact their nursing advisor for an admission application to the nursing program.

### University Core Requirements (19 hours)

*At least 16 credit hours of the following must be completed in addition to prerequisites prior to admission to the nursing program. All university core must be completed prior to completion of BSN degree. A "C" average is required, but any course with a grade of "F" must be repeated.*
