Program Description

The MS in Health Administration and Education is a 40-hour program with a focus on administration and leadership in the healthcare setting, as well as education for healthcare professionals. Graduates will be prepared to:

- apply both administrative and business theories in leadership roles in the healthcare industry.
- apply educational theories and concepts to the classroom setting.

The goal of this program is to prepare professionals for administrative and educator roles that facilitate quality patient care in the increasingly complex healthcare industry.

Flexible and Convenient

- 100% online with a practicum component
- Annual Fall admission
- Program can be taken on a full-time or part-time basis; can be tailored to individual needs (but must be completed within six years)

Admission Requirements

In addition to the general admission requirements to the graduate school, each applicant must:

- 1. Submit a completed application to William Carey University for the graduate school.
- 2. Submit official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended.
- 3. Submit a statement of professional goals.
- 4. Submit a current resume.
- 5. Submit two recommendations. (a reference form will be emailed to the references entered in the online application).
- 6. Submit the completed and notarized criminal background check affidavit.
- 7. Hold a health-related baccalaureate degree, or its equivalent, from a nationally accredited school.
- 8. If professionally licensed, registered, or certified in a healthcare field, the student must hold a current unencumbered license, registry, or certification with no pending legal or state board action.
- 9. Have an overall undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or a GPA of 2.5 on the last 30 undergraduate hours.
- 10. Be eligible to re-enter any previously attended college or university in good standing.
- 11. Demonstrate computer literacy involving proficiency in word processing, email correspondence, and the internet.

Program Progression Requirements

 Demonstrate competency in scholarly writing by submission of GRE Analytical Writing score of 3.5 or better within the last five years or passing HAE 6000 Scholarly Writing for Healthcare Professionals with a grade of 'B' or better prior to taking courses within the program.
