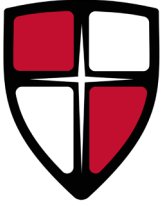

## **POLICY STATEMENT**

William Carey University's admission policy is designed to provide educational opportunities for students in accordance with the University's mission and goals. The admission of students to William Carey University is within the jurisdiction of the University and shall be in accordance with the University's mission and goals.

## **PROCEDURES**

(1) Undergraduate Admission. Undergraduate students must meet the general admission requirements as set forth in the University's undergraduate catalogue, published annually and available online at <https://catalog.wmcarey.edu/index.php>.

(2) Early Entrance Program Admission. Early entrance programs offer high school students' opportunities to earn college credits before graduating high school. Students applying for an early entrance programs must meet the general admission requirements as set forth in the University's undergraduate catalogue, published annually and available online at <https://catalog.wmcarey.edu/index.php>, as well as those requirements for the relevant to the specific early entrance program.

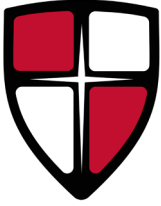
(3) Graduate and Post-Baccalaureate Admission. Graduate students must meet the general graduate admission requirements as set forth in the Graduate Catalogue of the University published annually and available online at <https://catalog.wmcarey.edu/index.php> as well as those requirements for the relevant academic unit and the Graduate School. College and program admission requirements are approved by the appropriate graduate admissions committees.

(4) Professional Program Admission. Students applying for a professional program must meet the requirements for the relevant program as set forth in the University's graduate catalogue, published annually and available online at <https://catalog.wmcarey.edu/index.php>.

(5) Admission of Students with Prior Misconduct. In the admission of students, the University may consider an applicant's character. The University may refuse to admit an applicant because of past misconduct, inaccurate or incomplete responses regarding past misconduct, or failure to notify the University of any changes in information prior to entry into the University.

(6) International Students. International students at all program or degree levels must meet the general international admission requirements for each program or degree level as set forth in the Undergraduate and Graduate Catalogues of the University, as well as the requirements for the relevant academic unit and the Graduate School, if applicable. Additionally, all international students are admitted to attend the institution in keeping with federal regulations pertaining to non-U.S. citizens as set forth by federal entities with jurisdiction, including but not limited to, United States Department of Homeland Security, United States Citizenship and Immigration Services, and United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement. All relevant federal regulation or regulatory guidance prohibiting initial admission or continued enrollment of
