

Practice Doctorate to Doctor of Philosophy

PhD in Health Education

Program Description:

The Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) in Health Education program is a terminal degree designed to:

- Prepare healthcare professionals as healthcare educators, scholars, and researchers.
- Prepare graduates for the educator role including the ability to use sound educational concepts, principles, and knowledge to develop undergraduate and graduate health professional students who will be able to contribute to the health and well-being of diverse populations across the lifespan

Flexible and Convenient

- Annual Fall admission
- Program can be taken in two- or three-year options or tailored to individual needs (must be completed within six years)
- HYBRID FORMAT: Doctoral classes will meet face-to-face and synchronously online at the designated times each semester; the remainder of the content and student activities will be conducted via the Canvas learning management system.

Curriculum:

- 17 credit hours awarded for a practice doctoral degree with 43 credit hours to be completed.
- Written comprehensive examination to determine mastery of the PhD content
- Each student must complete a guided dissertation.
 - Research courses are developed to help the students understand the research process and design essential components of a dissertation

Admission Requirements

To be admitted as a regular student, the applicant must:

- Submit a completed application to William Carey University and the graduate school
- Submit official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended
- Submit a scholarly narrative of 1-2 pages of personal philosophy of education and goals
- Submit current curriculum vitae
- Submit three letters of reference: two from individuals who can attest to research and scholarship and one personal reference
 - o A reference form will be emailed to the references entered in the online application OR
 - Reference letters are acceptable
- Submit the completed and notarized criminal background check affidavit
- Have earned a doctoral degree in a healthcare-related field from an accredited school
- Have earned a GPA ≥ 3.0 on doctoral-level courses
- If professionally licensed, registered, or certified in a healthcare-related field, have an active, unencumbered license, registry, or certificate with no pending legal or state board action
- Be eligible to re-enter any previously attended college or university in good standing. If previously enrolled in a PhD program, the applicant must provide a letter of good standing from that program.
- Demonstrate computer literacy involving proficiency in word processing, email correspondence, and the internet

Pre-Program Requirements:

Successful progression through the program requires the following:

- Demonstrate competence in scholarly writing prior to taking courses within the program through one of the following options:
 - o Submission of a GRE Analytical Writing Score of ≥ 3.5 within the last five years OR
 - Successfully complete HAE 799 Academic Writing for Doctoral Students with a grade of B or better
 - *If planning to take HAE 799 –Academic Writing for Doctoral Students, summer admission is required as the course is taught during the summer term.
- Demonstrate basic competence in statistics prior to taking HAE 707 Advanced Research and HAE 800 – Statistics through one of the following options:
 - Successful completion of an undergraduate or graduate level statistics course within the past 10 years with a grade of B or better OR
 - Substantial experience in healthcare research projects OR
 - Successful completion of HAE 700-Statistics Review for Doctoral Students

*If planning to take HAE 700 – Statistics Review for Doctoral Students, summer admission is required as the course is taught during the summer term.
