- Graduation from a nationally accredited associate degree or diploma nursing program
- Holds an unencumbered licensure as a registered nurse in all states where licensed with no pending legal action
- Be in good standing at William Carey University
- Have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 on all courses taken toward meeting the nursing degree requirement
