- **SL Tests:** In contrast, SL tests are more **multiple-choice and short-answer questions**. While these questions are still challenging, they are designed to cover the essential concepts and theories without requiring the same level of in-depth analysis as HL questions.
- **Exam Length:** HL exams are generally **longer** than SL exams, reflecting the more rigorous and demanding nature of the content covered in HL courses.
- **Assessment Frequency:** HL courses often have **more assessments** than SL courses, including internal assessments that are more demanding and rigorous.
- **Subject Coverage:** HL courses cover **more content** than SL courses, providing a more comprehensive understanding of the subject.
